Dr. Aileen Buckley has been making maps for over 25 years. She has a Ph.D. in geography from Oregon State University, a Masters in Geography from Indiana University, and a Bachelors in Geography and Spanish from Valparaiso University. She is a research cartographer at Esri where she focuses on the development of best practices for mapping. While she publishes and presents worldwide on many aspects of mapping and GIS, much of her research relates to space-time mapping, terrain representation, map use, and cartographic methods. She is a co-author of *Map Use: Reading, Analysis, Interpretation* and co-editor of the *Atlas of Oregon*. Aileen is a former president of CaGIS (the U.S. cartographic association) and is active in the International Cartographic Association. She is currently chair of the US National Committee for the ICA and lead delegate for the United States to the ICA.
