



Matt Rice is an Associate Professor of Geography and Geoinformation Science at George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia, where he teaches geographic information science and conducts funded research in geocrowdsourcing, accessibility, and spatiotemporal computing. He received his PhD in Geography from UC Santa Barbara in 2005, where he served as a researcher at the National Center for Geographic Information and Analysis (NCGIS). Dr. Rice was the President of CaGIS in 2017-2018 and served as the Local Arrangements Chair for ICC2017 in Washington D.C.



Kevin M. Curtin is Professor of Geography and Director of the Laboratory for Location Science at the University of Alabama. He performs primary research in the field of Geographic Information Science with specializations in location science, transportation and logistics, spatial movement behavior, spatial statistics, and network GIS. Application areas for his research include autonomous vehicle logistics, transportation geography, crime studies, health and nutrition, and geospatial intelligence.
