She is an associate editor of *Travel Behaviour and Society* and serves on the editorial boards of *Journal of Transport Geography*, *Applied Geography*, *International Journal of Geographical Information Science (IJGIS)*, and *Geographical Analysis*. Her research interests include environmental health, human mobility, sustainable cities, urban, transport, and social issues in cities, and GIScience.



Margaret Levenstein

An economist, Dr. Margaret Levenstein first joined ISR's Survey Research Center (SRC) in 2003 as the executive director of the Michigan Census Research Data Center (MCRDC), a joint project with the U.S. Census Bureau. She has taken an active role at ISR, joining the Director's Advisory Committee on Diversity in 2009 and serving as the chair of ISR's Diversity, Equity and Inclusion strategic planning committee and as the liaison to the larger university program.
